### Examination Results 2011

I hope you will take the time to study the (I)GCSE, AS and A Level results later in this newsletter. The students in the senior classes have once again done themselves, their families and the School, proud. Full credit to them and their teachers - 100% pass rate at A Level, where 73.2% were A\*/A/B, is sim-

ply excellent. Mougins School is an open access school - it does not test for entry, nor does it select its students on academic performance. What a fantastic achievement, therefore, when the A\* to C pass rate at (I)GCSE (Form 11) was 89.2% and 43.4% of these good passes were A\*/A. For some critics, “the grass may be greener on the other side of the fence”, but it is also very green at Mougins School - well done all!

### University Destinations

Last year’s graduates have left and are on their way to the next stage of their education. Their immediate destinations are to be found in this newsletter – an impressive list of institutes of higher education worldwide. We are pleased to announce that none of our students went into “clearing”, which is a type of pool for students who do not quite achieve the grades they need for their chosen universities. All of our students were accepted to their first choice of university.

### Athletics - Sports Day

This annual event will take place on Friday 7<sup>th</sup> October (next Friday) at the Stade Eric Estival in Mandelieu for Forms 5 to 13. Students should be taken directly to, and collected from, the stadium. Should the weather make this inter-house competition impossible, the reserve date is Tuesday 11<sup>th</sup> October. Parents are

welcome to spend the day, or any part of it, supporting the students. Full details will be/have been distributed separately.

### Two Parking Issues:

1. There is a reserved car parking space, at the beginning of the main car park, just past the Hall entrance, on the left. It is marked “Reserved” with a red background. At the Gala Dinner and Dance last May, a” parking space for a year” was one of the items for auction. Two families won the bid for this space. **Please do not park in this space.** As there is no Gala next year, I will open a silent auction after the Spring Vacation for the use of the space for 2012/2013.
2. The construction companies will be using their own entrance/exit throughout the building work. We are very fortunate they are not sharing our entrance and exit. It is essential therefore, that no one blocks their exit (as was the case last week) – just after our exit on the right. Thank you for your consideration.

### Homework Timetable

The Secondary School Homework Timetable is to be found in this newsletter for Forms 7 to 11. It will help parents to see when homework

is set and how long, on average, it will take to complete. Students will write down the due day for their homework in their agendas. Some homeworks are due the next day, others almost a week after they are set. Missing homework produces a red homework slip, given to tutors. Three homework slips and tutors will contact parents. Excellent work and effort are rewarded by Commendation Forms (see Family Guide).

### **Advanced Warning – G20 in Cannes**

The next G20 summit meeting is to be held in Cannes on 3/4<sup>th</sup> November 2011. We return to School after the half-term break on Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> November. Getting to and from School could prove considerably more difficult for a number of our families. If you live south of the A8 Autoroute, we suggest you make the necessary enquiries to find out how you will be affected and how to overcome some of the inevitable road closures.

## Examination Results

Summer 2011

### (I)GCSE

There were 297 separate (I)GCSEs taken last summer. Grades A\*, A, B & C are accepted by universities and are necessary for a student to continue a particular subject to AS and A level.

Results for (I)GCSEs are given for Form 11 only, including any subjects they took a year early in Form 10. The A\*-C pass rate this year was – **89.2%**. Of the 38 students in Form 11, **89.5%** achieved at **least 5** (I)GCSEs with A\*-C

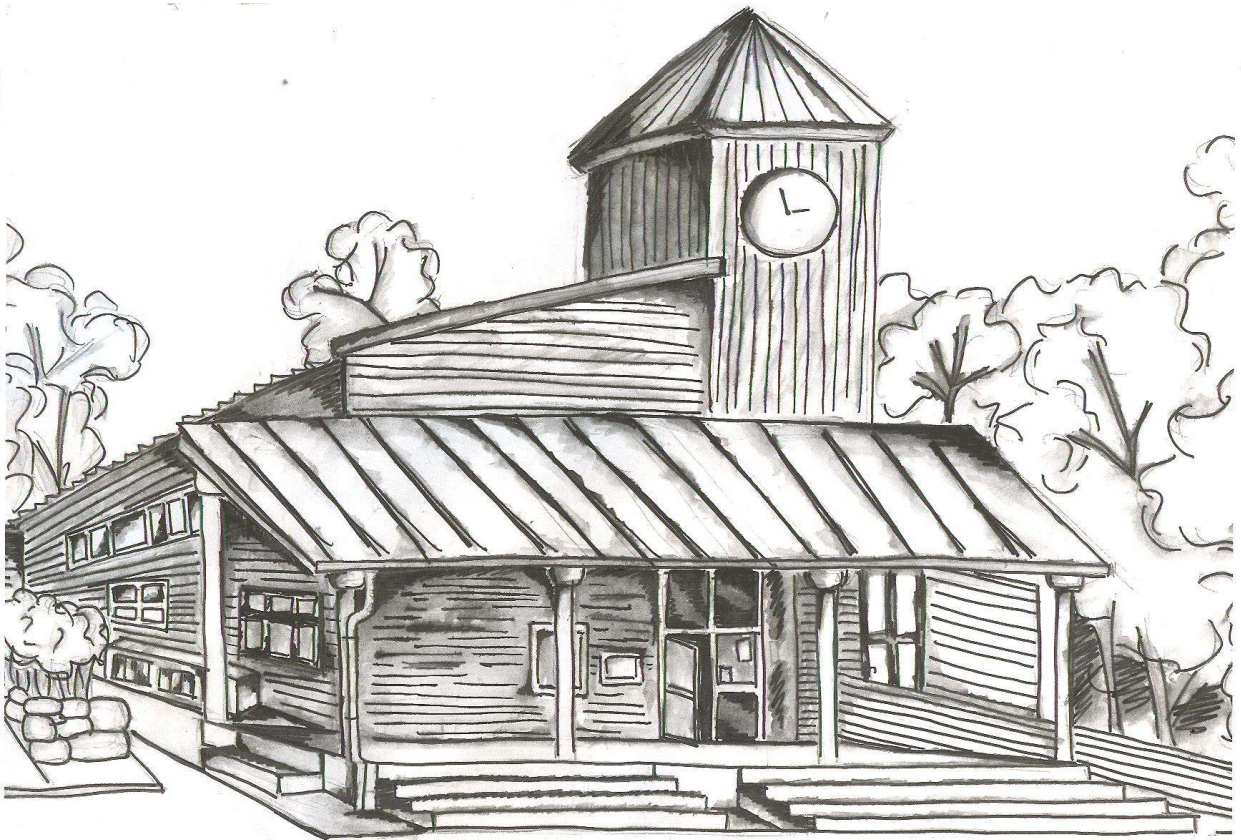
## Secondary School Parent's Evenings Autumn Term 2011

## From the Desk of Sue Dunnachie

Mougins School has a long-standing policy of being involved in fundraising for charity and, over the years, we have supported local, national and international causes. Last year saw the completion of fund raising for the purchase of a Guide Dog and our students were introduced to both the dog and its owner and were able to realise what a wonderful gift of independence was achieved with the 16,000€ we raised. Bi-annually we participate in Red Nose Day, a nation wide fund-raising event in Great Britain. We also support World Aids Day on an annual basis. We have raised money to assist those affected by the earthquake in Haiti, the destruction of the twin towers in New York and the Tsunami in Japan, to name but a few. We also participate in the collection of 'les pièces jaunes', a national collection of centimes which goes towards alleviating the suffering of hospitalised children in France. This year we hope to continue giving our support where it is needed. This does not always have to be uniquely financial and we are in the process of putting in place a partnership with the **Pandrata Circle** which is a Cultural Association between France and India ([www.pandratacircle.com](http://www.pandratacircle.com)) and supports the creation of an international library which is both educational and for research. In

association with **Selectours Travel Agency** we are organising the shipment of several hundred kilos of school text books which may be out of date for us but will be extremely welcome at the centre in the village of Gokarma in the state of Karnata, as well as novels in good condition. Naturally, there are expenses involved in the shipment and, in view of the fact that we have not had the time to organise fundraising for this cause, the PTA has generously agreed to pay 800€ towards this; Selectours will take the responsibility for a larger sum to complete the operation.

Please take the time to look at the website as we hope that this partnership will flourish and be a rich and rewarding one.

In celebration of the 'Semaine du Goût' (The Week of Taste), the chef of the **Moulin de Mougins, Sebastien Chambru**, will be working with students in Form 6V in the Café des Amis on Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> October. He will organise a competition relating to 'taste and presentation' and will then choose eight of the most successful students to go to the Moulin de Mougins the following day and have a cookery lesson. This is an exciting opportunity for our students to experience the world of gastronomy for which Mougins is so famous.
